### **Research Interests**

I am a practicing primary care pediatrician trained in health services research whose research focuses on health care services for children, Medicaid policy, and the intersections between them. The major focuses of my work are (1) improving access to and the quality of health care for children enrolled in Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), (2) understanding the influence of health insurance policies and health care systems on care received by children and youth with special health care needs (CYSHCN), and (3) evaluating health care delivery and policy innovations.

### **Clinical Interests**

My clinical practice focuses on comprehensive primary care for children and adolescents, especially those with special health care needs and those from Spanish-speaking families.

### **Clinical Track Scholarly Contribution**

#### **Clinician-Research Scholar**

My contribution on the clinician-research scholar pathway will be through conducting health services research, obtaining external funding for my work, and contributing to the training of future scholars in health services research. I will seek foundation and federal funding for the (1) evaluation of the impact of state and federal Medicaid policies that are hypothesized to influence child health and family wellbeing and (2) identification of opportunities to improve primary care for children enrolled in Medicaid and potentially the development of interventions to improve this care. Additionally, I will collaborate with current faculty to support the implementation and evaluation of programs of the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services to improve care for children in the state. As part of my faculty role, I will contribute to the mentorship of fellows, junior faculty, and other trainees in health services research methods and completion of their scholarly projects.
